TWO SEPTOGENERIANS IN THE WHITSUNDAYS (2009)

Bob Reeves in his Yacht 'Cassandra of Melbourne' (Mottle 33) and David Edwards in his yacht 'Pom Pom' (H28) are currently enjoying a warm winter in the Whitsunday Islands. Warmer than normal, with temps 28/30 each day, and more North Easterlies than South Easterlies this year. Cassandra was sailed up from Melbourne 5 years ago and Bob and Jan have been spending the last 5 winters up here. Cassandra has been left at Gladstone at the end of each winter. Pom Pom has been mine for 15 years but has only been up here 6 times. I have managed to only sail back three times, the first with Les Brown. Pom Pom is normally kept at Hastings Yacht Club. We have both been members of the Western/Melbourne Trailables for many years.

I have managed to sail in the Great Whitsunday Fun Race at Airlie Beach 4 times but this year it was very eventful. Luckily Bob sailed with me and we started by leaving my dinghy on an unused buoy. We were in division 3 for Yachts under 30 feet. The wind was blowing 20/25 so I wouldn't have been game to sail on my own as I did the previous year.

There were about 100 boats in the event with the large older Schooners and Wooden boats only having to sail out and back with their crowds of backpackers on board. We started with full main and slightly furled jib doing 6+ knots out in a reach out to Pioneer Rock. Rounding a buoy we ran down to Grimston Point at the top of Woodwark Bay with full main and full jib poled out. Then came the hard bit beating to windward somewhat overpowered in the 20+ breeze. We still had plenty of boats behind us and seemed to be doing well on Pom Pom's worst point of sail. Probably due to our years of experience, expertise, tactics and an innate sense of modesty! However, with about 200 metres to go to the finish back at Airlie after a 16 mile race there was a bang! The 6mm by 30mm wide tang at the

end of the bowsprit parted. The forestay, jib and furler swung out alongside the main. On most vachts this would be when the mast came down. However Pom Pom is a Herreschoff H28 and is very strongly rigged and the two forward lowers held the mast up. Bob immediately turned down wind so that the mainsail would also keep the mast up. I grabbed spanners and hastily undid the inner forestay which wasn't in use. It seemed to take me ages! I finally got it on and tightened it as best I could. Normally one would also use the spinnaker halyard or spare jib halyard but these were trapped by the furler at the top of the mast and couldn't be moved. Quickly then the jib was pulled out of the foil and bundled on deck and the main was dropped. I then made a booking for the Marina for a week next to Bob.

HOW LUCKY WAS I! On inspection, the tang, which was hidden between two other tangs, was rusted inside at the top of a welded fillet. The only external evidence would have been a hairline crack which I missed when I rerigged 6 years ago. The remaining effective metal was only about 3mm on each side! i.e. 6mm out of 30 holding it up! MUCH BETTER TO BREAK IT IN THE WHITSUNDAYS THAN IN BASS STRAIT GOING HOME!!

I now have a wider piece of 316 stainless welded over it and have also taken the opportunity to renew the bobstay wire.

So back we go to enjoying the Whitsunday Islands while Bob awaits a truck to take his boat home to Melbourne and I wait for Nick to come and help me sail back to Sydney and then two others help from Sydney to Hastings, arriving hopefully early December.
