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Top Of The Bay Trailable Race & Commodore's Cup The inaugural Top Of The Bay Trailable Yacht Race was conducted on Sunday 4 October in conjunction with the MTYC

The inaugural Top Of The Bay Trailable Yacht Race was conducted on Sunday 4 October in conjunction with the MTYC Commodore's Cup in very good sailing conditions for opening the sailing season. Fourteen trailable yachts competed including some visitors and new members to MTYC. Two Divisions based on Class Based Handicap were established and in the light morning winds the first start was postponed to 11.30 and the second start at midday.

A light sea breeze filled in and very close racing around the top of Hobsons Bay took place with some tight mark rounding, particularly in the vicinity of Station Pier. *Emocean*, a Castle 650 lead much of the second lap around the course and held on to gain line honours, closely followed by RL 24 Liaison (Adrian Cassar) and Noelex 25 Tainui (Ron Parker).

The visitors and members enjoyed the day's sailing and following the race there was overwhelming support to conduct a similar event again. The committee has taken this onboard and will work with Yachting Victoria's Trailable Yacht Committee to find an appropriate date in next year's calendar to ensure good support from visiting participants. At the post race presentation the sponsors, Ronstan and PIB Insurance, were acknowledged and thanked for their generous support. In addition, Peter Clarke was thanked for his support in providing his yacht *"Kashmir"* as the official boat for race management.

Thanks must also go to several committee members, in particular, Lloyd Graham for assistance with event preparations

and facilitating Ronstan's support. Thanks also to Jan Reeves for supporting the event on the day with pre race administration and kindly loaning the set of flags used for race management.
