VHF Radio Extension Speaker For The Cockpit

A recent race day event highlighted the need to be able to hear VHF radio transmissions clearly from the cockpit in windy conditions with plenty of background noise to contend with. Of course this need to be able to clearly hear the radio is equally applicable whilst cruising. Extended motoring might also be a time when being able to hear radio transmissions in the cockpit is also necessary.



A simple solution is to simply plug in to your radio a portable extension speaker and have that mounted either very close to the companionway or even temporarily stowed whilst sailing in a halyard rope bag just outside the companionway.

Readily available off the shelf are a number of makes and the one below is produced by GME for marine use, is water resistant and retails for less than \$20.

If relying on a compass mounted in the cockpit, give some thought to keeping this portable speaker some distance from the compass.

Water resistant extension speaker with lead and plug.
