Commodore's Report

Since our last newsletter, things have been busy on the water with some of the best sailing weather for sometime.

The summer race series continues with good fleet numbers, with Race 6 held on the 8th Feb with 8 starters and Race 7 held on the 27th Feb attracting 11 starters. This year in the summer series, we have 18 different yachts competing, easily the best numbers for several years.

The twilight series continues, with good average fleet numbers, however the strong afternoon sea breezes has played havoc with several of the races needing to be abandoned.

We have had several club members compete in the Geelong Scandia week and 1 yacht Cruise around Corio Bay over the January weekend. We have had 6 yachts enjoy the cruise around Western Port and French Island on the weekend of 14th & 15th February and 9 yachts enjoy one of the best Marley Point overnight races for many years.

Over the coming weeks we have the Summer Race number 8 on the 15th March, the Trailable Yacht Festival in Geelong on the 28th & 29th March, Race 9 on the 5th April followed by Easter at Yarrawonga. So hopefully you can come along, participate and enjoy the fun of Racing and Cruising in company.

Thursday Night Sailing

The run of bad weather continues to interfere with the twilight sailing this year. Having had four nights prior to Christmas cancelled, it has been frustrating to deal with further cancellations and bad luck with forecasts. The 29 January was an interesting evening for a sail. The morning forecast for Port Phillip advised of the change due early evening of around 15-20 knots and possible stronger gusts with the change. The 4.40pm weather forecast advised of a southerly change of around 15-20knots and deleted any reference to the stronger gusts.


Given the day had been 44 C, sailing along in a light northerly wind whilst waiting for the cool change to arrive seemed like a reasonable way to spend the evening. The wind averaging around 5 to 10 knots from the north, all the boats had large sails up and were relatively closely bunched.

Out to the west a line of grey appeared on the water and the ships at anchor in the distance had started to swing. Then the change hit. The graph below explains it all – a rapid rise to 25-30 knots.

The fleet dropped or changed jibs and reefed mains, whilst beating out to the B Mark. Consensus was reached to abandon and return to shore, given the uncertainty of how long this new southerly breeze was going to last.

It was nice to see everyone readily cope with the dramatic change. Another Thursday night sail to remember.

The APC Logistics MARLAY POINT OVERNIGHT RACE


MARCH 7TH 2009



2009 Trailable Yacht Festival

The 2009 Trailable Yacht Festival, now in its 5th year, will once again be hosted by the Geelong Trailable Yacht Club from its base at St Helens on the shores of Corio Bay.

The Festival is a three-day event commencing on Friday 27th March, but if you can't get the Friday off work, the program will take into account some people will register on the Saturday.

The program will follow the same general format as in other years but also introduce different activities that we trust will appeal to TY owners and their families. For example, we will be conducting a "Cockpit Swap session" on the Saturday morning where TY owners can buy/sell/barter/give away various surplus or preloved items of yachting equipment that might be of use to others.

The proposed program is:

Friday morning:	Registrations, rigging and launching time
Friday afternoon:	Relaxing or sailing or Geelong tourist spots explored
Friday evening:	Happy hour, guest speaker at St Helens. Overnight at St Helens
Saturday morning:	Registrations, Cockpit Swap Session, boat judging commences
Saturday afternoon:	Official opening, cruise/Poker Run to finish at Royal Geelong Yacht Club
Saturday night:	Festival dinner with guest speaker Mr Ted Peers, former lighthouse keeper at many locations around the Victorian coast. Overnight at RGYC
Sunday morning:	Sail back to St Helens, marine demonstrations and displays (including a flare demonstration, so bring your out of date flares!)
Sunday afternoon:	Pre-paid lunch and official close

The earlier time for the 2009 Festival will hopefully mean warmer weather! Why not think about more than the just the weekend and taking a week or more holiday with the boat; based at St Helens/RGYC to fully enjoy what Corio Bay cruising and the Geelong area has to offer

Trevor Bland (*Run n Racin -* Austral Clubman 8032) gives his view on the new marina at Safety Beach.

Located at Safety Beach, Mornington Peninsula, Melbourne, Victoria

Martha Cove Marina and public boat launching is now in operating as of January 2009.

I have attached photos of the new ramp and marina which will make a great weekend stopover or just a day out on the bottom end of the bay . Attached is berthing schedule agreement that can be pre-filled out and put on file at the marina office. Also a rate list for berthing . The pricing looks a bit exy at first glance but when broken down it is worth it eg. A 10 metre berth for 1 night = \$59.00 this fee includes ramp fees which is \$15 per day eg. \$15 to launch Saturday and \$15 to retrieve on Sunday.

The ramp is privately operated by Martha Cove Security, open to the public and only open from 6.00am till 6.00 pm daily hence the \$15 a day charge . Both car and trailer are under surveillance camera making this one of the most secure launch sites around.

As the photos show the Martha Cove project is still in construction mode and toilet facilities are primitive but I am sure things will improve soon. I hope that this is of use to all fellow trailer yachties as it now gives us a new safe harbour location to launch and sail from.
